





6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Majority of the teachers use LCD projector and laptop for teaching apart from the conventional black-board method of teaching,
- *Students are given project work and taken on a study tour & industrial visits.
- *Science students are encouraged to participate in Eco awareness programs and model making.
- Unit tests are conducted and assignments are given to students to asses and improve their academic ability. Students are also provided with study material, question bank and scheme

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Examinations are conducted as per direction and time table provided by Tumkur University. However to facilitate better performance, Term examination is conducted well in advance before the main exams. The valued scripts are returned to students with proper remarks & advise.

The college is very proud of this green and pollution-free ambience which has been conducive to a good educational ambience. The Forum of life science initiated the mission 'Green campus – Clean Campus' under the leader ship of Prof . K.Siddappa, HOD of Botany .
